ENGLISH PROGRAM



Canada College's Department of Modern Languages offers English as a Second Language (ESL) and French as a Second Language (FSL) as its major language programs. Besides the main ESL and FSL programs, the school offers instruction in a number of other languages including Italian, Spanish, Portuguese, Japanese, Korean, German, Mandarin, Cantonese, Russian, Turkish, Arabic and Persian.

The study of another language broadens an individual's point of view. Students not only progress linguistically – advancing their reading, writing, listening and speaking skills – but also gain a broad awareness of other cultures. Through interaction with fellow students from different parts of the world, students expand their horizons and become global citizens.

LEVEL I: (100 hours)

This course is designed for "true" beginners and will begin with the very basics of English grammar. Students will learn how to introduce themselves and greet others, how to give and understand simple directions and how to ask and answer specific questions.

LEVEL II: (100 hours)

This course is a continuation of Level I therefore students enrolling in this course should already have some basic knowledge of English (i.e. the alphabet, numbers, how to conjugate verbs in the present tense, and be able to perform the tasks as described in the previous course). Upon completion of Level II, students should be able to speak about work, family, their interests, the weather, and to participate in brief conversations.

LEVEL III: (100 hours)

The level 3 of the English as a Second Language program proposes a communicative approach to language learning. This course is designed to build the learners' competencies in English while developing their skills in speaking and listening, as well as reading and writing. The course focuses mainly around conversation, practical exercises and role playing.

LEVEL IV: (100 hours)

Student enrolling in this course should already be able to communicate in English and must already have a general understanding of English grammar (i.e. present, past and future tenses). At the end of this course, students will be able to participate in conversations with greater ease. Students at this level will also work at developing their writing skills.

LEVEL V: (100 hours)

Upon completion of this course, students will have achieved a level at which they feel comfortable and confident enough to participate in conversations and discussions on general topics. Students will also have developed the skills to begin communicating with ease in writing emails, text messages and essays.

LEVEL VI: (100 hours)

Designed for students with a good foundation in English, this course offers students a thorough grammar review and multiple opportunities to improve their language skills and to make progress toward fluency. Students practice speaking, reading, writing, and listening in and outside the classroom. Materials include literary texts from authors such as Voltaire, Rousseau, Baudelaire and other francophone writers, and various audio-visual materials.

LEVEL VII: (100 hours)

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to participate effectively in most formal and informal conversations on practical, social and professional topics. Students will also be able to obtain and analyze information and opinions and will learn how to co-chair meetings and debates. Students will have mastered enough of the language to enable them to

do advanced tasks such as defend an opinion, deal with hypothetical issues, and discuss complex work-related issues.

LEVEL VIII: (100 hours)

This course is designed for students who have successfully completed English Advanced I or who have the recommendation of the Department Head. The course focuses on refining conversational skills and reviewing essential grammar points, as well as exploring advanced grammar and complex sentence structure. Contemporary Canadian culture is highlighted.

LEVEL IX: (100 hours)

A Survey of English Literature

An introduction to English Literature. Lectures, reading, discussion in English. Includes an historical survey of English civilization comprising developments in art, music, philosophy, and science. Readings in English literature from the Middle Ages to today. Advanced essay writing is emphasized through book reviews.

Comprehensive TOEFL iBT Preparation (48 hours)

Prerequisite(s): Placement by ESL assessment test, completion of Advanced Level ESL with a grade of C or better, or consent of the department. Comprehensive TOEFL iBT test preparation for ESL/EFL students includes detailed analysis and intensive practice for all four test components: listening, grammar, reading, and writing. Also includes test-taking strategies on both timed and untimed practice tests.

Review of English language skills and practice for the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL iBT).

Includes grammatical structure and written expression.

Review of English language skills and practice for the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL iBT). Includes listening comprehension and writing.

Review of English language skills and practice for the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL iBT). Includes vocabulary, reading comprehension and essay writing.

English in Medicine

This course is designed for those professionals who are trained in a language other than English and wishing to work in a English environment.

This course is open to doctors, nurses, and any other professionals who are required to have the high standing English knowledge to be able to function in the workplace.

Business English

Business English is a basic course designed for high-intermediate students of English as a second language who wish to improve their written and spoken business communication skills. The course focuses on level-appropriate grammar, introduces vocabulary specific to various business domains, and familiarizes students with the finer points of business etiquette and business correspondence.

International students should apply at least 5 months prior to the start day of their program.
