The Health, Assistance and Nursing program prepares you with the skills to become a nurse or nursing assistant. These professionals assist nurses, hospital staff and physicians in the basic care of patients. They perform duties related to patient care and comfort. They deliver basic health care to patients in order to support their optimal quality of life. Nursing assistants carry out a variety of essential tasks and are an important part of a health care team.

Program objectives

To acquire the knowledge and ability necessary to differentiate between health and illness; acquire the knowledge and ability to understand and apply the techniques learned, establish a helping role with those with health needs, engage in teamwork within the modern health organization, communicate effectively with patients and their family, with superiors and with other health team members.

- Become familiar with a comprehensive approach to health – 30h

- Apply basic care procedures – 105h

- Provide care to clients with mental health problems – 75h
- Provide care to clients undergoing physical rehabilitation – 120h
- Provide care in a surgical unit – 90h

- Intervene with a child or adolescent with a health problem – 30h
- Provide care to children and adolescents – 30h
- Provide care to a diverse clientele – 105h

- Provide care in a medical unit – 120h
- Refer to their knowledge of the cardiovascular and respiratory systems when providing care – 75h

Admission Criteria

To be eligible for admission to this program leading to a Diploma of Vocational Studies (DVS/DEP), candidates must meet one of the following requirements:

- Hold a Secondary School Diploma or its recognized equivalent, for example, an Attestation of Equivalence of Secondary V studies, or a postsecondary diploma such as a Diploma of College Studies (SEC) or a Bachelor's degree
- Be at least 16 years of age on September 30 of the school year in which their training is to begin and have earned the Secondary IV credits in language of instruction, second language and mathematics in the programs of study established by the Minister, or have been granted recognition for equivalent learning
- Be at least 18 years of age upon entry into the program and have the following functional prerequisites: the successful completion of the General Development Test or recognition of equivalent learning

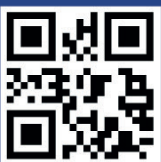
This program of professional studies prepares students for the practice of the profession of personal care attendant and live-in caregiver in the health and social services field.

Program objectives

The purpose of this profession is to provide assistance and care to clients of all ages with physical, psychological or psychosocial illnesses or disabilities in the public, private and community networks. The purpose of the profession is to compensate for the person's incapacities and to assist them in maintaining or restoring their autonomy and state of health.

Program Content – Competencies

- Situate oneself with regard to the profession and the training process - 30h
- Establish a supportive relationship - 60h
- Adopt relational approaches with clients presenting cognitive or mental problems and neurodevelopmental disorders - 60h
- Determine how to intervene in relation to the needs of clients with physical illnesses and disabilities - 60h
- Accompany clients in everyday situations - 75h
- Prevent infections and contamination - 30h
- Provide assistance with activities of daily living - 120h
- Dealing with high-risk situations - 30h
- Intervene with clients requiring assistance at home or in an alternative living environment - 105h
- Assist clients receiving end-of-life palliative care - 30h
- Dealing with family, social and cultural realities - 60h
- Consider rules and procedures in the administration of medication and invasive care to assist with activities of daily living - 45 hours
- Provide assistance in relation to the clinical reality of the client - 60h
- Provide first aid – 30h
- Intervene with clients requiring short-term assistance - 75h
